SUMMARY OF INFORMATION/BACKGROUND:

REQUEST

Staff has received a rezoning application from Brent Perkins, owner of Trumade Holdings, LLC to rezone an 0.88 portion of one (1) parcel of land totaling 2.02 acres. The request is to rezone the property from its current zoning of Residential Three (R-3) to the General Business (G-B) zoning district. The property is home to TruLock Storage Solutions. The applicant would like to construct one more storage building at this location at this time.

BACKGROUND AND SITE ANALYSIS

The property has existing mini warehouses on the western half of the property. Property records indicate this use of land dates back to 1988. Prior to 2019, the current property was two (2) separate parcels. The parcel with the mini-warehouses is zoned General Business (G-B) and the adjacent parcel is zoned Residential Three (R-3). In August of 2019, the Trumade Holdings, LLC purchased both parcels and combined them into one parcel (Deed 2421 / Pg. 527).

The parcel is described as follows:

The 911 address of the parcel is 3495 NC 18 S. Morganton, NC. The parcel is further identified in county records as (PIN# 2712910324 and REID# 33856). As mentioned above, the parcel is 2.02 acres. The property currently has four (4) storage buildings with 64 individual storage units. As mentioned above, the applicant is wanting to construct one (1) additional 20-unit storage building at this time. The parcel is located within the Morganton Township of Burke County. The property is located within the Salem Fire District and adjacent to the Salem Fire Station. The parcel is not located within a Water Supply Watershed. The parcel has 450 linear feet of frontage on NC 18 S. and 389 linear feet of road frontage on Zero Mull Road (SR# 1811). The parcel is approximately 1.5 miles from the Morganton city limits. The parcel is not within any Overlay District.


SURROUNDING AREA

The subject parcel and four adjoining parcels to the west are zoned General Business. The zoning to the north, south, and east is Residential Three (R-3) and Residential Two

(R-2). There are multiple scattered site single-family homes in the area as well as one (1) named subdivision (Laurel Heights) to the north on Laurel Heights Drive.

The Existing Land Use Map and the 2018 aerial photo also provide a visual representation of the existing land uses in the area. The current Zoning Map shows where the current zoning districts are located.



The Existing Land Use Map above shows this property as vacant. This again, is due to the fact that this was a separate and vacant parcel of land when the map was created. The map does indicate that the mini-warehousing parcel has a commercial use associated with it. The parcel colored blue indicates an Office/Institutional use which corresponds to the Fire Dept. The two (2) other General Business properties are

mistakenly colored white, indicated vacant land. One parcel is actually a commercial storage yard and the other parcel has a cell tower on it.

CONFORMITY WITH THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

The current land use plan for Burke County is the 2016-2030 Blueprint Burke Strategic Land Use Plan. The parcel is located in the Rural Agricultural Area and just on the fringe of a "Secondary Growth Area", (see map below). The Rural Agricultural Area is designated to all areas which are outside of either the Primary Growth Area or the Secondary Growth Area. These areas are typically considered rural in nature and access to infrastructure and utilities will be more limited. Residential uses either scattered among large tracts of land or located within rural residential subdivisions are expected. Other commercial, institutional, and industrial development is expected as needed to support the residential and agricultural nature of the area. Mini-storage facilities would be considered one of those uses which support residential and other land uses.




Burke County, NC Zoning Administration Future Land Use Map



CONFORMITY WITH THE BURKE COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE

As stated earlier, the “current” zoning district for this parcel is Residential Three (R-3). The Zoning Ordinance defines the R-3 District as “a less restrictive medium density residential district that allows a broader range of residential uses including single and multi-section mobile homes and a greater variety of compatible non-residential uses in areas that may be less suburban in nature”. Although the R-3 district allows a broader range of non-residential uses, the “Mini-Warehouse” use as defined in Section 402 and regulated within Section 920, is not permitted.

The “proposed” General Business (G-B) District designation “is established to provide suitable locations for those commercial activities which serve the general public, including those which function rather independently of each other”. The Current Zoning Map (below) shows the zoning for the subject parcel and surrounding area. The Zoning Map shows that the subject parcel is adjacent to existing General Business zoning. Although there is also existing residential zoning and residential uses in the area, the proposed use of the land would simply be an expansion of an existing use. In the scheme of commercial development, the proposed mini-warehouse use is less impactful on surrounding properties than other general businesses. The Community Development

Department has never received any complaints regarding the existing mini-storage business.



STAFF COMMENTS

Although, the area surrounding the subject parcel is predominately zoned residential, there are also existing commercial land uses in the area. The mini-storage facility can be considered supportive of different types of uses, including residential use.

Any proposed commercial development would have to go through the Site Development Plan Review process. As part of the Site Plan review, various departments such as NCDOT, Environmental Health, Building Inspections, and others would review the plan for compliance with that department's/agency's own rules, regulations, and ordinances. One of the requirements would be to screen the storage facility from adjacent residential zoning and uses. The existing storage facility is not screened. The applicant is aware that if the rezoning were approved, the entire facility would have to meet the screening requirement. Until the proposed project met all dept./agency requirements, a zoning permit to construct the new storage building would not be issued.

Staff would recommend approval of rezoning the property to General Business for the reasons mentioned above.

PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDATION

The Burke County Planning Board met on May 25, 2020 to hear this rezoning request. The Planning Board chairman opened the public meeting and proceeded with the agenda. Staff was asked to present the report for the proposed rezoning request. Following staff's presentation, the chairman asked the applicant to present his request. Once the applicant finished, the chairman opened the public comment portion of the meeting and asked if there was anyone from the public who wished to speak to the rezoning request. There were no citizens to speak. The chairman closed the floor to public comment and asked the Board if they had any questions of staff or the applicant. The Board had no questions. The chairman asked for a motion to be made. Board member Tunstill made a motion to recommend approval of the rezoning application and stated his reasoning. Board member Cultrera seconded the motion. **The chairman asked for a full vote of the Board and the motion carried unanimously 6-0 to recommend approval of rezoning request ZMA 2020-01.**




§ 122C-118.1. Structure of area board.

(a) An area board shall have no fewer than 11 and no more than 21 voting members. The board of county commissioners, or the boards of county commissioners within the area, shall appoint members consistent with the requirements provided in subsection (b) of this section. The process for appointing members shall ensure participation from each of the constituent counties of a multicounty area authority. If the board or boards fail to comply with the requirements of subsection (b) of this section, the Secretary shall appoint the unrepresented category. The boards of county commissioners within a multicounty area with a catchment population of at least 1,250,000 shall have the option to appoint members of the area board in a manner or with a composition other than as required by this section by each county adopting a resolution to that effect and receiving written approval from the Secretary. A member of the board may be removed with or without cause by the initial appointing authority. The area board may declare vacant the office of an appointed member who does not attend three consecutive scheduled meetings without justifiable excuse. The chair of the area board shall notify the appropriate appointing authority of any vacancy. Vacancies on the board shall be filled by the initial appointing authority before the end of the term of the vacated seat or within 90 days of the vacancy, whichever occurs first, and the appointments shall be for the remainder of the unexpired term.

(b) Within the maximum membership provided in subsection (a) of this section, the membership of the area board shall reside within the catchment area and be composed as follows:

- (1) At least one member who is a current county commissioner.
- (2) The chair of the local Consumer and Family Advisory Committee (CFAC) or the chair's designee.
- (3) At least one family member of the local CFAC, as recommended by the local CFAC, representing the interests of the following:
 - a. Individuals with mental illness.
 - b. Individuals in recovery from addiction.
 - c. Individuals with intellectual or other developmental disabilities.
- (4) At least one openly declared consumer member of the local CFAC, as recommended by the local CFAC, representing the interests of the following:
 - a. Individuals with mental illness.
 - b. Individuals with intellectual or other developmental disabilities.
 - c. Individuals in recovery from addiction.
- (5) An individual with health care expertise and experience in the fields of mental health, intellectual or other developmental disabilities, or substance abuse services.
- (6) An individual with health care administration expertise consistent with the scale and nature of the managed care organization.
- (7) An individual with financial expertise consistent with the scale and nature of the managed care organization.
- (8) An individual with insurance expertise consistent with the scale and nature of the managed care organization.
- (9) An individual with social services expertise and experience in the fields of mental health, intellectual or other developmental disabilities, or substance abuse services.
- (10) An attorney with health care expertise.
- (11) A member who represents the general public and who is not employed by or affiliated with the Department of Health and Human Services, as appointed by the Secretary.

- (12) The President of the LME/MCO Provider Council or the President's designee to serve as a nonvoting member who shall participate only in Board activities that are open to the public.
- (13) An administrator of a hospital providing mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse emergency services to serve as a nonvoting member who shall participate only in Board activities that are open to the public.

Except as provided in subdivisions (12) and (13) of this subsection, an individual that contracts with a local management entity (LME) for the delivery of mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse services may not serve on the board of the LME for the period during which the contract for services is in effect. No person registered as a lobbyist under Chapter 120C of the General Statutes shall be appointed to or serve on an area authority board. Of the members described in subdivisions (2) through (4) of this subsection, the boards of county commissioners shall ensure there is at least one member representing the interest of each of the following: (i) individuals with mental illness, (ii) individuals with intellectual or other developmental disabilities, and (iii) individuals in recovery from addiction.

(c) The board of county commissioners may elect to appoint a member of the area authority board to fill concurrently no more than two categories of membership if the member has the qualifications or attributes of the two categories of membership.

(d) Any member of an area board who is a county commissioner serves on the board in an ex officio capacity at the pleasure of the initial appointing authority, for a term not to exceed the earlier of three years or the member's service as a county commissioner. Any member of an area board who is a county manager serves on the board at the pleasure of the initial appointing authority, for a term not to exceed the earlier of three years or the duration of the member's employment as a county manager. The terms of members on the area board shall be for three years, except that upon the initial formation of an area board in compliance with subsection (a) of this section, one-third shall be appointed for one year, one-third for two years, and all remaining members for three years. Members shall not be appointed for more than three consecutive terms.

(e) Upon request, the board shall provide information pertaining to the membership of the board that is a public record under Chapter 132 of the General Statutes.

(f) An area authority that adds one or more counties to its existing catchment area under G.S. 122C-115(c1) shall ensure that the expanded catchment area is represented through membership on the area board, with or without adding area board members under this section, as provided in G.S. 122C-118.1(a). Subject Title: Comm. Dev. - Resolution to Withdraw the Linville Dam Boardwalk and Trail Project from the STBG-DA Program

Presented By: Shane Prisby

Summary of Information: Because of ongoing cash flow issues and the COVID-19 pandemic, NCDOT has halted projects statewide, including the Linville Dam Boardwalk and Trail.

The Community Development Department has been working with NCDOT and the Western Piedmont Council of Governments on what next steps can be taken. After these discussions, the Community Development Department feels that the best way forward for the project is to withdraw the project from the STBG-DA program and seek out other, more flexible opportunities that will have lower costs and impacts. Both NCDOT and the COG are understanding of the situation and the funding would be reassigned to a different project. There would be no cost or penalty to Burke County to return the funding as no money has been spent.

Community Development is requesting that the \$100,000 grant match that was approved and budgeted by the Board as part of the FY 20 budget be reallocated to engineering and grant matches for construction. Community Development has begun discussions with Duke Energy on ways to incorporate this project with their Comprehensive Relicensing Agreement projects at the Linville Dam and Bridgewater Access sites.

Budgetary Effect: Return the \$400,000 STBG-DA grant.

County Manager's Recommendation: Approval is recommended.

Suggested Motion: To adopt Resolution No. 2020-19 and reallocate the \$100,000 grant match for engineering and construction of the project. 


Background/Project Understanding

LaBella Associates, P.C. (LaBella) understands that Burke County requires professional engineering and environmental consulting services over the fiscal year from July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021. The services to be provided include general consulting and continuing environmental monitoring and reporting for the County's three landfills: the active Johns River Waste Management Facility (Permit 12-03), the closed Kirksey Drive Landfill (Permit 12-01), and the closed East Burke Landfill (Permit 12-02).

The Johns River Waste Management Facility is located in the north-central portion of Burke County, north of Morganton, North Carolina. The 318-acre landfill property includes an old, unlined municipal solid waste (MSW) landfill covering 28 acres in the southwest corner of the landfill property which began operation in April 1988, but was closed in 1998 to comply with Rule .1627(c)(10)(A) of the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules (NCSWMR). Burke County operated a permitted Construction and Demolition (C&D) disposal area on top of the closed portions of the MSW landfill between 1998 and 2016. The C&D-over-MSW landfill was closed in 2016. The old C&D-over-MSW landfill is monitored under an assessment monitoring program and a corrective action program. The corrective action program includes monitored natural attenuation (MNA), phytoremediation, and control of landfill gas. A Corrective Action Evaluation Report (CAER) is required every five years. The next CAER is due following the second semiannual monitoring event of 2020.

An expansion of the Johns River C&D landfill is located northeast of the old landfill. The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ) issued a Conditional Approval of Site Suitability on February 28, 2014, which approved the northern halves of Phases 1 and 2 (designated 1A and 2A), and all of Phases 4 through 8; however, it did not grant site suitability for the southern halves of Phases 1 and 2 (1B and 2B) or Phase 3. A Permit to Operate Phase 1A was issued by NCDEQ on August 14, 2014. Phase 2A was completed and the NCDEQ issued a temporary permit to operate Phase 2A on November 7, 2018, while the County continued construction of Phase 4. We expect Phase 4 to be completed in 2020. Phases 1A, 2A, and 4 are monitored under a detection monitoring program.

The Kirksey Drive Sanitary Landfill is located approximately two miles northwest of downtown Morganton, North Carolina. The landfill has been closed to the reception of waste since 1985. The landfill operated as Burke County's MSW Landfill between 1968 and 1985.

The East Burke Landfill is located in eastern Burke County, North Carolina. The facility operated as an MSW landfill between 1972 and 1988 and has been closed to the reception of waste since 1988. Burke County operates a solid waste convenience center at the entrance of the closed landfill.

Task 01 – General Consulting (FY 2021)

A. Scope

The purpose of this task is to provide general consulting services to the County, on an as-requested or as-needed basis for the Johns River, East Burke, and Kirksey Drive Landfills. Services may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Technical and operational assistance for the landfills and/or transfer station;
- Conceptual and preliminary engineering designs and drawings relating to the County’s solid waste management program;
- Response to requests for information by NCDEQ, and assist with other correspondence and interaction with regulatory agencies on behalf of the County;
- Groundwater or surface-water resampling events required due to statistically significant increases or other sampling events beyond the scope of routine compliance monitoring;
- Preparation of Alternate Source Demonstrations, revisions of Water Quality Monitoring Plans or Corrective Action Plans, or other non-routine groundwater reporting;
- Landfill gas re-monitoring events due to exceedances or other regulatory issues;
- Development and/or implementation of Landfill Gas Remediation Plans, revision of Landfill Gas Management Plans, or other non-routine landfill gas reporting;
- Presentations to the County Board of Supervisors as requested to update and educate Board members on issues relating to the County’s environmental program;
- General project management and administrative services relating to the consulting services described above; and
- Other services as the County may have need.

B. Deliverables

Specific deliverables will be determined on an as-needed basis.

C. Schedule

Schedules and fees for specific services will be determined as needed and will be approved by the County prior to initiating work.

D. Limitations

Client-generated activities beyond approved scopes or in excess of the estimated budget are subject to additional charges billed at hourly rates plus expenses or negotiated fees and may affect the project schedule accordingly.

Task 02 – Semiannual Water Quality Sampling & Analyses (FY 2021)

A. Scope

The scope of this task is to provide Burke County with the necessary environmental services to provide semiannual groundwater and surface water sampling and analytical services at the County's three solid waste management facilities in accordance with the NCSWMR. The requested services are groundwater and surface-water sampling (including a two-person crew, travel, equipment, and supplies), laboratory coordination, and subcontracted analytical fees, and the required reporting for two semiannual sampling events at each of the three sites (Johns River Landfill, Kirksey Drive Landfill, and East Burke Landfill). The two events include the second semiannual sampling event of 2020 and the first semiannual sampling event of 2021.

For the old landfill at the Johns River facility, this scope includes sampling six compliance monitoring wells and one field blank for the NC Appendix II list of constituents plus C&D parameters and 1,4-dioxane during the second semiannual event of 2020. Samples from the same locations will be analyzed for the NC Appendix I plus C&D parameters and detected Appendix II constituents plus 1,4-dioxane during the first semiannual event of 2021. In addition, four of the compliance wells will be sampled for MNA parameters required by the Corrective Action Plan (CAP) for the facility during both events. One other compliance well is sampled for only the Appendix I list plus C&D parameters during both events. Two sentinel wells will be sampled for the facility's constituents of concern [COCs - currently, eight volatile organic constituents (VOCs) plus beta-BHC and 1,4-dioxane], plus MNA parameters during the second semiannual event of 2020 only. Two surface water points will be analyzed for the Appendix I list plus detected Appendix II constituents and 1,4-dioxane during both events. A field blank and trip blank will also be collected.

For the C&D Expansion Area at the Johns River facility, including Phases 1A, 2A, and 4, six compliance wells will be sampled during both semiannual events for the NC Appendix I list of constituents plus C&D parameters and 1,4-dioxane, and one additional surface water point will be sampled for Appendix I list plus detected Appendix II constituents and 1,4-dioxane during both events. Also, five additional observation wells and piezometers in the area between the two landfills will be sampled for the VOCs that are on the old landfill's list of COCs, plus dissolved methane, as requested by the NCDEQ.

This scope also includes semiannual sampling for NC Appendix I constituents plus 1,4-dioxane for eight groundwater monitoring wells and three surface water monitoring points at the Kirksey Drive facility and four groundwater monitoring wells and two surface water monitoring points at the East Burke facility, plus one field blank and one trip blank for each facility. The sampling events for these facilities will be conducted in conjunction with the Johns River sampling events.

B. Deliverables

Deliverables under this task include performance of the above-described semiannual sampling events. Reporting for the second semiannual event of 2020 will be covered under Task 03 (Semiannual Water Quality Reporting) of this proposal; however, reporting for the first semiannual event of 2021 will be covered under the FY-2022 budget, yet to be contracted.

C. Schedule

The sampling events are scheduled for the last quarter of 2020 and the second quarter of 2021.

D. Limitations

- The fee for these services assumes that the sampling for all three sites is accomplished in one mobilization covering 4 consecutive days for each event.
- The fee for this task assumes no significant changes to the detected Appendix II constituents list or the COC list, or any other changes in sampling or analytical requirements due to detections, exceedances, or changes in regulations.

The scope of this task is to provide Burke County with the necessary environmental services to provide required reporting associated with semiannual groundwater and surface water sampling at the County's three solid waste management facilities in accordance with the NCSWMR. This task includes preparation and submittal of two Semiannual Water Quality Monitoring Reports (each) for the Johns River old C&D-over-MSW Landfill, the Johns River C&D Expansion Landfill, the Kirksey Drive Landfill, and the East Burke Landfill, for a total of eight reports. One set of reports will be for the first semiannual sampling event of 2020, and one will be for the second semiannual sampling event of 2020. (Reporting for the 1st semiannual event of 2021 will be covered under the FY-2022 budget, yet to be contracted.) The reporting services may include the following: laboratory data review and evaluation, data table updates, groundwater map updates, statistical analyses of results, Biochlor modeling (once per year), trend analysis, MNA evaluation, report updates and review, as well as production and submittal costs, as appropriate for each site and each event.

B. Deliverables

Deliverables will include the following reports:

- These services do not include any additional reporting associated with resampling events that may be warranted due to detections or exceedances, nor do they include alternate source demonstrations, negotiations with NCDEQ regarding exceedances, or any similar services. - Note that we do not currently have a surveyed map or surveyed locations/elevations for wells at the East Burke Landfill, and these costs are not included in this Task. If the NCDEQ requires and/or the County wishes to upgrade the WQMRs for East Burke to include well information, groundwater elevation tables, and groundwater maps, these services will be provided on a time-and-expense basis under Task 01 (General Consulting).

Task 04 – Quarterly Landfill Gas Monitoring (FY 2021)

A. Scope

The scope of this task is to provide Burke County with the environmental services necessary to comply with NCSWMR with regards to quarterly landfill gas (LFG) monitoring at the Johns River, Kirksey Drive, and East Burke facilities. This Task includes the quarterly monitoring of 10 existing gas probes and 16 designated monitoring points, including all structures, at the Johns River Waste Management Facility.

For the Kirksey Drive Landfill, this Task includes the monitoring of six existing gas probes, the County animal shelter, and the Friends-for-Animals (SPCA) building during all four quarterly events. For the East Burke Landfill, this task includes monitoring of six existing gas probes during all four quarterly events.

B. Deliverables

A summary letter for each site will be prepared and submitted to Burke County along with the monitoring logs after each quarterly monitoring event. In the event of a reportable exceedance of regulatory gas concentrations in one or more of the probes or monitoring points, and/or at Burke County’s request, copies of the reports may also be submitted to NCDEQ as required by the NCSWMR.

C. Schedule

The quarterly monitoring events will be performed in the third and fourth quarters of 2020 and the first and second quarters of 2021. The fourth and second quarter events will be performed in conjunction with the semiannual water quality monitoring events. Quarterly landfill gas monitoring reports for each site will be delivered to the County within 30 days of the monitoring events. If there are exceedances of regulatory requirements, notification of the exceedances will be submitted to the NCDEQ within 5 business days of the monitoring event as required by the NCSWMR.

D. Limitations

- The fee for this task assumes that landfill gas monitoring events scheduled for the fourth quarter of 2020 and the second quarter of 2021 will be performed in the same mobilization as the water quality sampling events scheduled for those quarters.
- This proposal does not include any additional remonitoring events or additional reporting or communications necessitated by exceedances or circumstances beyond LaBella’s control. Remonitoring events and/or related services will be performed on a time-and-expense basis under a separate task (Task 01, General Consulting), if warranted.

The scope of this task is to provide Burke County with the environmental services necessary to maintain the landfill gas extraction unit (GEU) at the Johns River facility. This task includes quarterly balancing of the seven gas vents on the old landfill and quarterly system checks for the GEU and flare equipment. These quarterly events will be conducted in conjunction with the quarterly landfill gas monitoring events described in Task 04, and so will require no additional travel time or equipment costs.

The quarterly system checks for the GEU will include visual inspection of the GEU/skid components, checking the differential pressure at the knockout pot, the differential pressure at the flame arrester, condensate levels in the knockout site tube and adjacent manhole, propane tank level, and visual inspection of the control panel. It may also include performing a shutdown and startup to make sure all components are in working order.

Also included in the scope for this Task is an annual system maintenance and cleaning event, including cleaning the demister pad in the knockout pot and the flame arrester by spraying with an air compressor or power washer.

B. Deliverables

There are no physical deliverables for this Task other than communication with the County regarding any issues encountered during O&M events.

C. Schedule

The quarterly O&M events will be performed in the third and fourth quarters of 2020 and the first and second quarters of 2021, in conjunction with the LFG monitoring events, beginning with the first quarter after startup of the GEU.

The annual maintenance and cleaning event will be tentatively scheduled for the second quarter 2021.

D. Limitations

- The fee for this task assumes that the quarterly LFG O&M events will be performed in the same mobilization as the LFG monitoring events described in Task 04.
- The scope and fee for this Task do not include any additional O&M events or related services required due to problems with the GEU or other issues beyond LaBella’s control. Such activities, if needed, will be performed on a time-and-expense basis under a separate task (Task 01, General Consulting), if warranted.
- The scope and fee for this task do not include any repairs to the GEU other than routine adjustments and cleaning. Repairs, if needed, will be performed on a time-and-expense basis under a separate Task (Task 01, General Consulting), or they may be subcontracted out, if warranted.
- Client-generated activities beyond the above scope are subject to additional charges billed at hourly rates plus expenses or negotiated fees and may affect the project schedule accordingly.

Task 06 – Landfill Gas Remediation for the East Burke and Kirksey Drive Landfills

A. Scope

The purpose of this task is to provide consulting services to the County for the closed East Burke and Kirksey Drive Landfills, for implementation of the Landfill Gas Remediation Plans approved by the NCDEQ in 2018. Services may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Planning, coordination, and supervision for the installation of 3 gas intercept trenches totaling approximately 500 linear feet at the East Burke Landfill;
- Planning, coordination, and supervision for the installation of 3 gas intercept trenches totaling approximately 400 linear feet at the Kirksey Drive Landfill;
- Preparation of Landfill Gas Remediation Reports for the East Burke and Kirksey Drive Landfills; and
- General project management and administrative services relating to the consulting services described above.

B. Deliverables

Deliverables will include:

- A Landfill Gas Remediation Report for the East Burke Landfill; and,
- A Landfill Gas Remediation Report for the Kirksey Drive Landfill.

C. Schedule

- The pre-bid site visit will be scheduled within 30 days of County approval of the bid-phase documents or as negotiated with the County and/or NCDEQ.
- Gas intercept trench construction will be scheduled within 60 days of the pre-bid site visit or as negotiated with the County, the construction contractor, and/or NCDEQ.
- Gas intercept trench construction will be completed within 30 days of beginning of construction or as negotiated with the County, the construction contractor, and/or NCDEQ.
- The Landfill Gas Remediation Reports will be submitted to the County for review and then to the NCDEQ within 30 days of completion of all gas intercept trench installations.

D. Limitations

- The estimated budget does not include contractor or material costs for installation of the gas intercept trenches as it is assumed these costs will be billed directly to the County by the contractor.
- The estimated budget assumes the six intercept trenches will take no more than ten days to install and that they will all be done within a consecutive two-week period. If due to weather, contractor issues, or other factors beyond LaBella’s control, the installation takes longer, additional budget may be required.
- These scope and estimated budgets do not include any surveying that may be required either before or after construction of the gas vents and trenches.

Task 07 – SWPPP, SPCC Plan, and NPDES Permit Updates for the Johns River Facility

A. Scope of Services

This task includes providing professional consulting services to Burke County to update the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plans (SWPPPs) for the Johns River Landfill and the Garage and Operations Area at the Johns River Facility. This task will also include the preparation of a Spill Prevention, Control, and Countermeasure (SPCC) Plan for the facility. The following bullet outline summarizes the professional services proposed for this task:

- Perform a site visit to conduct on-site assessment and evaluation of current conditions, including aboveground oil storage tanks, containers, spill control structures, potential pollutant sources, and storm water management structures;
- Update the facility's Storm Water Control Map to reflect current conditions and permit requirements, including the size of the property, location and extent of significant structures and impervious surfaces, locations of all storm water conveyances, pathways of storm water flow, drainage basin boundaries and the number and location of storm water outfalls;
- Provide monitoring instructions and a schedule for reporting monitoring results;
- Submit draft SWPPPs and SPCC Plan for review by Burke County;
- Finalize the SWPPPs and SPCC based on the County's comments and submit to the County for incorporation into their Operating Records; and
- Prepare applications to renew the Facility's NPDES permits and submit them to NCDEQ.

B. Deliverables

The deliverables for this task are:

- Updated SWPPP for the Johns River Landfill;
- Updated SWPPP for the Johns River Garage and Operations Area;
- Updated SPCC plan for the Johns River Facility; and
- Updated NPDES Permit Applications.

C. Schedule

The draft documents will be completed within 75 calendar days of complete execution of this addendum, and subject to the limitations provided below. The final SWPPPs and SPCC plan will be completed and submitted to Burke County within 15 calendar days after receiving the County's comments. The NPDES Permit Applications will be submitted to NCDEQ within 30 calendar days of completing the final SWPPPs and SPCC Plan.

D. Limitations

The associated fee is based on the following assumptions:

- If applicable, any NCDEQ fees will be paid directly by the County and are not included in the proposed fee.
- This task does not include the preparation of detailed design, technical specifications, or record drawings. No surveying is included in this task.
- This task does not include any meetings other than the initial site visit that may be conducted with the County or NCDEQ. Should meetings be required relating to the SWPPP and SPCC, time and expenses will be charged in accordance with LaBella’s current rate schedule under a separate task (Task 01 – General Consulting).
- This task assumes that the storm water management system is adequate for the facility. If major changes to the storm water management system are required, design of those changes are not included as part of this scope of services.
- It is understood that the scope of services for this project does not include preparation of responses to comments from regulators that may result from their review of the SWPPP and SPCC joint plan during a site inspection. If required, responses to regulatory comments will be handled under a separate task (Task 01 – General Consulting).

Task 08 – Corrective Action Evaluation Report (CAER)

A. Scope

The scope of this task is to provide Burke County with the necessary environmental services to provide required reporting associated with corrective action at the John's River Waste Management Facility in accordance with the NCSWMR. The Corrective Action Plan (CAP) and the NCSWMR require a Corrective Action Evaluation Report (CAER) every five years. The next CAER is due after the second semiannual monitoring event of 2020.

The corrective action program for the C&D-over-MSW landfill includes monitored natural attenuation (MNA), phytoremediation, and control of landfill gas. The CAER must evaluate all three remedies and their effectiveness over the last five years. The CAER will include plume maps for all Constituents of Concern (COCs), plus total volatile organic compounds (VOCs), and cross sections showing the vertical extend of the total VOC plume. The COCs include:

- Benzene;
- 1,4-Dichlorobenzene;
- Methylene chloride;
- Tetrachloroethene (PCE);
- Trichloroethene (TCE);
- 1,1-Dichloroethane;
- 1,2-Dichloroethane;
- Vinyl chloride.
- alpha-BHC
- beta-BHC
- 1,4-dioxane
- Cobalt

The CAER will also include review and evaluation last 5 years of data, including water quality data, MNA data, and landfill gas data. Trend charts for all COCs will be prepared, and any changes in the physical and/or chemical characteristics of the plume or the aquifer will be evaluated. The MNA remedy will be evaluated using Biolchlor modeling and the USEPA MNA matrix evaluation. The effectiveness of phytoremediation and control of landfill gas will also be evaluated. The CAER will then make recommendations regarding continuance and/or needed changes to the corrective action program.

The CAER will be prepared in conjunction with the Second Semiannual Water Quality Monitoring Report (WQMR) of 2020, covered under Task 03.

B. Deliverables

Deliverables will include the following reports:

- One CAER.

C. Schedule

- In accordance with the NCSWMR, the CAER must be submitted to the NCDEQ in conjunction with the Second Semiannual WQMR of 2015 within 120 days of completion of the second semiannual sampling event of 2020. LaBella will submit a draft CAER to the County to review at least 7 calendar days prior to the due date to the NCDEQ.

D. Limitations

- The scope and fee for this task assumes no new constituents of concern are added to the facility COC list, and that no additional sampling or monitoring activities are required beyond those described in Tasks 02 and 04 of this proposal.
- The scope and fee for this task do not include any response to NCDEQ comments or requests for additional information after the CAER is submitted.
- The scope and fee for this task do not include any costs of implementing changes to the corrective action program or monitoring programs that may be recommended by the CAER or required by the NCDEQ.
- Client-generated activities beyond the above scope are subject to additional charges billed at hourly rates plus expenses or negotiated fees and may affect the project schedule accordingly.


